

List of Useful Websites

- Look on newspapers' or companies' or organisations' own websites.
- Attaching a '+' means the search engine only looks for words in a particular order. For example, if you type 'lake district', all sites with the words 'lake' or 'district' will be found but if you type 'lake+district', only sites with both words in that order will be listed.
- Attaching a '-' will exclude a certain word. For example, a search for 'lake -district' would only look for 'lake'
- Search for phrases by adding quotation marks - words enclosed in double quotes will appear together in all return documents exactly as you entered them, for example, "finding a graduate job"
